It should be recognized that White Gold is an old, very special Whistler subdivision with many full time residents who live and work here and also help a lot with the housing shortage by renting out rooms/suites to workers.

The economic hardship that looms over many due to Covid 19, increased cost of living expenses, increasing interest rates, already high and increasing property taxes which might force many to sell and move.

Very sad that a totally unnecessary "beautification" project can be the cause of this change in my neighbourhood.
