4. PUBLIC QUESTION AND ANSWER PERIOD

E. Dearden, 206-1420 Alpha Lake Road

E. Dearden asked if emissions were included in greenhouse gas inventories for float planes and helicopters in Whistler.

Mayor J. Crompton and General Manager of Corporate and Community Services, T. Battiston advised this is not a requirement and our numbers should match other communities based on protocols for local governments.

E. Dearden asked if Council was looking at the impacts of incendiary devices?

Mayor J. Crompton advised this has been discussed but not on the work plan.

E. Dearden asked if Council would consider narrowing the highway and widening the sidewalk along the highway to allow for better access for e-bikes.

Mayor J. Crompton advised the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure is responsible for and maintains the highway.

E. Dearden asked if the RMOW is lobbying for this or can private citizens take this on.

Mayor J. Crompton advised private citizens are welcome to take this up with MOTI.

E. Dearden asked if RMOW can learn from other local governments' policies, for example a local developer is required to have full parking allocation which is currently holding up the project. The City of Vancouver allows a reduction of the parking requirements for certain rezoning proposals, is this something the RMOW can also implement?

Mayor J. Crompton advised Whistler is always looking to take advantage of policies from other communities to review and improve our policies.

E. Dearden noted a local company was not aware of how much fossil gas they were burning in the cold winter months due to the way that the gas was included in the lease.

Mayor J. Crompton advised that this type of information and data is important to the community achieving targets and is useful to help educate our community.

D. Titus, 4770 Bear Paw Trail

D. Titus asked if there was any information regarding recently cut vegetation at Green Lake.

Chief Administrative Officer, V. Cullen advised Bylaw Services was called to investigate and provided letters to the homeowners in the area reminding them that they are not permitted to cut down this vegetation.

D. Titus asked regarding the origin of the Noise Bylaw Report on tonight's agenda.

Mayor J. Crompton advised that the main remaining question was related to construction start and finish times.

General Manager of Corporate and Community Services, T. Battiston explained that originally the bylaw had been presented to Council for a variety of updates that were needed.

D. Titus asked if the Noise Bylaw Report is considering extending construction hours through the week including Sundays noted visitors would prefer no construction noise on Sundays.

Mayor J. Crompton advised that report is on the agenda which will provide staff's recommendations for this topic.

E. Dearden asked if there is any consideration of overnight cooling shelters during the summer months.

Mayor J. Crompton advised overnight cooling centers was something the RMOW was examining and that the RMOW provided cooling centres last summer through the daytime, but not through the evenings.

E. Dearden asked if there were exiles from Pemberton and Lillooet due to forest fires or other events, would we have the capacity to host Whistlerites in these emergency cooling centres.

Mayor J. Crompton advised that he believed there were sufficient hotel rooms if that was deemed necessary.
