PRESENTATIONS/DELEGATIONS

Updates

RMOW Bylaw Services

A presentation by A. Collum was given regarding RMOW Bylaw Services activities and a discussion was held.

- 5 calls for service regarding unsecured garbage including a pick-up truck with an open bed full of old food and garbage. Education provided, tickets and warning notices issued
- 1 call for service regarding 2 x bird feeders. Education provided and warning notices issued.

A. DeJong

A presentation by A. DeJong was given regarding bear sightings.

- No longer working for Vail, so cannot provide an update on bear movement reported on Whistler or Blackcomb mountains
- Bear sightings in Nordic of sow and three yearling cubs
- Advised we are about three weeks behind average spring green-up due to La Nina and to expect bears in valley longer

RMOW Environmental Stewardship

A presentation by A. Dowling and T. Schaufele was given regarding RMOW Environmental Stewardship activities and a discussion was held.

- Introduction of new Bear Smart Program Assistant
- Request for a new Co-Chair as C. Ruddy is stepping down
- Conversations have continued with Riverside Campground Manager. Riverside management is moving forward with several strategies suggested in 2021 including stronger carabiners, bear caches and increased signage. A centralized eating area has also been suggested which may be trialed in coming months. Images will be sent to Riverside to assist with messaging
- Researching citizen science techniques which could be adopted in Whistler, an update will be provided
- Wildlife Alerts issued for aggressive bear on Alta Lake Road and valley trail closure implemented at request of COS
- BSPA to contact Air BnB about reaching owners in Whistler area to provide educational information to guests
- BSPA to contact Strata and property rental managers with rental one page document

Whistler Wildlife Protection Group

A presentation by I. Minic-Lukac was given regarding Whistler Wildlife Protection Group activities and a discussion was held.

- Patrols performed on Whistler Golf Course (WGC), some nights seeing 14 bears grazing. The course opens May 12th so patrols have now stopped
- Advised by some visitors to WGC they were told to go there to view bears, however not provided with bear viewing guidelines
- Some issues on WGC with dog owners being resistant when asked to stop walking dogs there/put dogs on leash due to bear activity

- Door to door education completed in Creekside, residents asked to remove attractants and bird feeders
- Multiple sightings of bears throughout the valley
- Cars stopping on highway to view bears

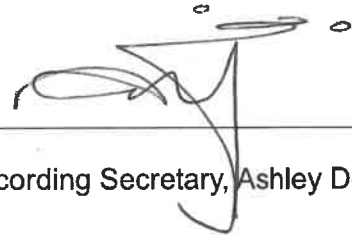
