This report seeks Council's consideration for the first three readings of the "Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Amendment Bylaw (Application Fee) No. 2345, 2022".

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DISCUSSION

Background

The Resort Municipality of Whistler (RMOW) is required to respond to freedom of information (FOI) requests in accordance with the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FOIPPA). RMOW Council enacted the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Bylaw No. 1088, 1995 (FOIPPA Bylaw) on February 6, 1995. The FOIPPA Bylaw and the corresponding Memo to Council are attached as Appendix A. The FOIPPA Bylaw sets out the requirements and fees associated with the RMOW preparing and releasing FOI requests.

Amendments to FOIPPA received Royal Assent on November 25, 2021. Those amendments included the introduction of a ten dollar (\$10) application fee for non-personal FOI requests. The purpose of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Amendment Bylaw (Application Fee) No. 2345, 2022 (FOIPPA Amendment Bylaw) is to include the new FOI application fee. The FOIPPA Amendment Bylaw also includes a few other minor housekeeping updates. Staff notes that all fees related to FOI requests are set out in FOIPPA and that these fees have not changed since FOIPPA was introduced.

Analysis

The FOIPPA Amendment Bylaw includes the following:

- Update the FOIPPA Introductory section reference
- Update the "Designation of Head" title
- Update the "Authorization of Assistance for Head" title
- Replace the previous "Schedule A SCHEDULE OF MAXIMUM FEES" with the new Schedule A "Schedule of Maximum Fees" adding the \$10 application fee (no other fee changes)
