## **RECOMMENDATION FROM THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER**

That the recommendation of the General Manager of Infrastructure Services be endorsed.

## **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

**That** Council consider giving first, second, and third readings to "Sewer Usage Regulation Amendment Bylaw (Alta Lake Road Time Extension) No. 2382, 2023".

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is to update Council regarding the need to further amend the Public and Private Sewer Usage Regulation Bylaw No. 551, 1987 and request Council approval to make this amendment. The specific item that this recommendation addresses is the allowance for properties to have 28 months to connect to the new municipal sewer after receiving official notice to do so, rather than the 18 months previously approved through "Sewer Usage Regulation Amendment Bylaw (Alta Lake Road) No. 2313, 2021"; due to difficulties in securing contractors to complete this work in the time allotted.

## DISCUSSION

## **Background**

On May 3, 2019 the Resort Municipality of Whistler (RMOW) sent out a formal petition to a section of properties along Alta Lake Road that were in need of a municipal sewer connection. The petition process was used after many unsuccessful grant applications. The petition was for the creation of two Local Service Area bylaws that would apply specifically to the parcels that will benefit from the installation of municipal sanitary sewer along the developed section of Alta Lake Road. The deadline to return petitions to the RMOW was August 30, 2019. The properties that returned the petition represented more than 50 per cent of the properties in the specified area, and more than 50 per cent of the total property value. The petition was given a certificate of sufficiency by the Corporate Officer.

The petition included the statement:

 All residential parcels in the service area would be required to connect to the new sanitary sewer 18 months after the completion of the project (staff would propose an amendment to Public & Private Sewer Usage Regulation Bylaw No. 551, 1987 to facilitate this timeline); Vacant land or undeveloped properties are exempt from the 18-month connection requirement.

"Sewer Usage Regulation Amendment Bylaw (Alta Lake Road) No. 2313, 2021, a bylaw to amend the Public and Private Sewer Usage Regulation Bylaw No. 551, 1987" was adopted on July 21, 2021 to allow for the extended 18 month connection period specified in the petition once the Notice to Connect dated August 27, 2021 was issued.

However, several property owners have informed the RMOW of their difficulty in engaging contractors to complete the required work within the 18 month connection period. This second amendment to the Sewer Usage Regulation Bylaw No. 551, 1987 will provide another 10 months for residents and their contractors to complete the required work in the 2023 construction season.

#### Comment(s):

The construction project has now been completed and RMOW staff have been actively engaged with the neighbourhood residents on a regular basis. Specifically to arrange for assembly and delivery of the RMOW supplied residential pump stations required on the majority of the lots. Information about the project is being shared in a number of different ways and the most up-to-date information for the project can be found on the RMOW website at: <u>Alta Lake Road Sewer Upgrade Project | Resort Municipality of Whistler</u>

An information package describing the steps for each property to connect was prepared and was sent out before the installation of the sewer main was completed in September 2021. Residents have been made aware via the RMOW website of the RMOW intent to further extend the deadline for the residential sewer connection through the 2023 construction season.

#### SUMMARY

Implementation of this bylaw amendment will extend the standard 180-day requirement to a 28month period for the properties to connect to the new sewer. This will provide adequate time for the remaining unconnected properties in the Alta Lake Road Sewer Extension Local Area Service to arrange for the delivery and installation of the required pump stations, electrical connections, and service lateral tie-ins to the sewer main.
