#### **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

**That** Council of the Resort Municipality of Whistler (RMOW) in open meeting assembled, hereby resolves that the RMOW, as a shareholder of Tourdex.com Systems Inc. pass the consent resolutions attached as Appendix A to this Administrative Report No. 23-014, and that the consent resolutions be executed by the corporate signatories on behalf of the RMOW.

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

The purpose of this report is to seek Council's approval and execution of the annual Shareholders' Consent Resolutions of Tourdex.com Systems Inc. (Tourdex)

#### DISCUSSION

#### Background

Tourdex is a holding company that owns the URL *www.whistler.co*m and has no other assets. 51 percent of its shares are owned by the Resort Municipality of Whistler (RMOW) and 49 percent of its shares are owned by Tourism Whistler.

The Directors of Tourdex have approved the Financial Statements and the Directors' Consent Resolutions are attached as Appendix B.

#### Analysis

The Shareholders' Consent Resolutions, attached as Appendix A, resolves that:

- the annual reference date be set as December 10, 2022;
- the Financial Statements of Tourdex for the fiscal year ended July 31, 2022 be accepted;
- Barrett Fisher, Virginia Cullen and Roger Soane be appointed as Directors of Tourdex; and
- the appointment of an auditor for Tourdex be waived.
