### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

The purpose of this quarterly report is to provide Council with a comparison of the annual budget amounts with actual year-to-date revenues and expenditures for operating departments and projects, and to advise Council of the status of the investment holdings as of September 30, 2022.

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### **DISCUSSION**

#### Background

At the end of the third quarter of 2022, Resort Municipality of Whistler (RMOW) overall operating revenues were at 91 per cent, and operating expenditures 74 per cent of their annual budgeted amounts. The 2022 outcome compares to 91 per cent and 74 per cent respectively in the third quarter of the prior fiscal year (2021). Budgeted amounts were amended once in 2022, and three times in 2021. The numbers presented here and in Appendix A reflect the as-amended figures.

As of September 30, 2022, actual net project expenditures reached 39 percent of total budgeted expenditures for the year.

Investment income for the nine months ended September 30, 2022 was \$2,183,980 (unaudited). This is 103 per cent of the total budgeted investment income for the year, and compares to prior-year amounts of \$1,775,370. A greater portion of interest income is typically collected in the second half of the year, compared to the first half. This reflects the impact of mid-year tax collection on short-term investment

balances.
