The Axemen Rugby Club is a volunteer run club that serves the Sea to Sky corridor rugby community. The club provides the only opportunity to play rugby within the area and attracts players between North Vancouver and as far north as Pemberton. The club currently has 2 mens teams competing in BC Div 2 and 3, a newly formed womens program and a youth section that welcomes all ages.

The purpose of this grant application is to further develop a youth rugby program for school aged children within Whistler. The Axemen Rugby Club are applying for a \$5000 grant to run a rugby program in Whistler throughout 2024. Of which, \$3500 would be put towards high school aged rugby and \$1500 would be used to promote the sport in Whistler Elementary schools.

Over the past few years the club has helped Whistler High School promote rugby and organize a number of exhibition games. As a result of this increased participation, the senior boys team (grade 10-12) has now entered the North Shore Schools league. With the \$3500 grant, the club will support the following: 35 sessions run at \$75 per session, coaching cost at \$2625.

- Coach and Support Snr Boys teams in the North Shore League (spring season) (20 sessions)

- Coach and support the Grade 8-9s team in an exhibition season in the fall of 2024. (10 sessions)

- Run an introductory program for girls rugby (5 sessions)

Support for travel to away games = \$500

Equipment provided, including mouth guards and safety equipment = \$375

Promotion of rugby in Whistler Elementary schools:

The club aims to run introductory sessions for all grade 5, 6, 7 classes in Whistler, teaching TAG rugby, the non-contact version of the game. The club then aim to run a festival of rugby for children of this same age group. With the \$1500 grant, the club will support the following:

- Equipment/Rugby Tags for festival of rugby = \$500 (to be given to schools afterward)

- Introduction to rugby coaching sessions = \$750 (10 coaching sessions across all Whistler Elementary schools).

- Festival organization and promotional material for 'next steps into rugby' = \$250.

Rugby provides a community and a support system for all it's players. A youth rugby program in Whistler opens many future opportunities for playing university sport, provides key social connections and promotes the world rugby values of discipline, respect, integrity, passion and solidarity.

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The club recently were awarded a grant from Whistler Blackcombe Foundation of \$12,000. This grant is being used to update all equipment for the mens, womens and junior sections. The grant also means the club can give a set of rugby balls to every elementary school in the Sea to Sky.

The club very recently (Jan 2024) applied for a Rugby Canada grant to support a Community Development Officer in the Sea to Sky. Applying for \$10,000 to support the part time working hours of this position.

The rugby club is planning on raising funds to lead a schools program at Howe Sound High School, Squamish, the RMOW CEP funding will allow the rugby club to replicate the schools program in Whistler.

The club is also awaiting the result of a \$2000 funding bid from Woodfibre, Squamish, this bid will help provide funds for travel costs to games for both the adult and youth section of the rugby club and will have nothing to do with schools programming.

No grants/funding have been rejected to date.

Finally, the Mens playing teams have warm up jerseys that acknowledge truth and reconciliation. Recognizing that the land we play on is part of the Squamish Lilwat nation.
