The purpose of the grant is to assist WYSC to cover a small amount of costs to keep soccer affordable for all its members.

Soccer is one of a few team sports in our community and keeping it accessible to all is extremely important.

## 1 – House Team Coaching Wages \$3000

To assist with offsetting some wages for our coaches who provides daily instruction during practices to our players for our preschool to U9 teams. These trained coaches also ensure that BC Soccer standards are upheld, and our players are getting the best experience possible. Our youngest players are given some of our best coaches to provide them the best chances to have proper skill development and game modeling as well as to ensure they have FUN!

## 3 – Tournaments \$3000

With the full return of tournament offerings for all age groups, WYSC will be registering our U10 – U18 Girls and Boys teams into one tournament each in the Spring and one in the fall (2 tournaments per year) this will mean approximately 11 of our teams that will participate in tournaments throughout the lower mainland and the Okanagan. Tournaments offer a wider opportunity to play against teams that are from different divisions and levels of play building as well they offer a chance for the team to travel and stay together building a sense of team and accountability to each other.

1/ WYSC has both volunteer and paid coaches who dedicate many hours to our organization, providing our community's youth with quality coaching, a safe and fun space to participate in sport.

2/ WYSC provides local youth the opportunity to participate in low-cost, year-round sport that encourages and promotes a healthy life-style through exercise and social connection. Team play is a great social learning experience and fosters respect and develops a sense of belonging and self-esteem.

3/ WYSC strives to give back to the community wherever possible. We partner with the primary schools by providing low-cost soccer instruction as an alternative to gym classes, which helps teachers learn new skills to use throughout the year and exposes all students to the game of soccer while at school, removing barriers to participation.

4/WYSC continues to provide two \$500 scholarships to Whistler Secondary School each year to 1 male and 1 female graduate who has shown exceptional characteristics whilst being a member of our organization which is used towards post-secondary education. WYSC has added an additional \$500 if a student attends Waldof and plays for WYSC and wises to apply for the scholarship. 4/ WYSC encourages older members to become qualified referees and supports and mentors them on the field. This helps them become confident in their capacity to referee and provides them with the opportunity to keep active and involved in the community whilst being paid.

5/ WYSC encourages and mentors older members to volunteer on field with younger players enabling them to complete required volunteer hours for school. It's also a great opportunity for all to experience new opportunities and be involved with various age groups within our community.

WYSC, the Pemberton Youth Soccer Association and Alphonse worked together with Squamish Youth Soccer Association to ensure that any player from Lifwat Nation that wanted to attend the BC Soccer coaching course that was being hosted in Pemberton be notified of the opportunity and be aware that all players/coaches attending would be reimbuirsed for the course fee.  WYSC will continue to look for ways to work collaboratively and engage any player from our local Indegenous Nations who wish to play soccer with WYSC.
