Thanks for the opportunity to present for the 2024 CEP funding. Whistler T-Ball was formed and funded in 2023 by my wife and I ( We wanted to provide the kids ages kids (3-5) in whistler with an avenue to engage in the team sport of baseball at a low cos for community members as well as great way for the kids to play in a team sport not yet offered in our town. With minor league baseball starting at age 6+, our program was designed to community members together every week to learn the sport of baseball, engage and be active.

In 2024, our goal is to bring 50 kids between the ages of 3-5 into our program which runs June 1st to July 27th. We require all parents to stay at the ball park during our sessions thus creating a a great way for parents to socialize with other members of the community.

This year will are budgeting to purchase New Jersey's and Hats for the kids. Additionally, we will need to purchase various pieces of new equipment which is outlined in our capital budget

Items include new helmets, a few dozen new baseballs, 4 bats, new cones, uniforms (hats and jersey tennis balls), bases, a storage shed and funding to provide a healthy snack for every player the end of every session. all our spends are highlighted in the 2024 budget.

This is our second year running the program. our goal is be able to field at least four teams of 10-12 players so we can begin holding real games near the end of t season. Our goal is register over 50 kids to the program and take the cost away from community members by raising money through community programs, member donations and sponsorships
