The purpose of this grant would be to allow for the Crisis Centre of BC to provide our safeTALK workshop (between 6-8 sessions) to the community of Whistler with the aim to have more local resources available to those in mental health crisis or need suicide intervention.

safeTALK is an internationally recognized LivingWorks program that features powerful presentations, audiovisuals, and skills practice to empower community members to recognize the signs of someone in destress and how to get them in touch with the right resources to get further help. participants report increased comfort with the topic of suicide and increased preparedness to ask about suicide and help the person with thoughts get connected to resources to help build safety. 99.9% of safeTALK participants highly recommend this training.

safeTALK trained staff improve an agency 's capacity to respond to suicide effectively. Participants will attain a certificate of completion from an internationally recognized evidence-based program. safeTALK is evidence-based with over 15 peer-reviewed reports and government studies, which found it:

Improves skills and readiness
Effective for participants as young as 15 years old
Helps break down suicide stigma in the community
Better skill retention compared to other connector programs

Our youth programs have seen success within the school districts in the Vancouver Coastal Health region; we have been able to complete 109 self-care workshops to classrooms ranging from grades 6-12. Programing for adults has been a high point for us here at the Crisis Centre with 29 safeTALK sessions completed, with an average of 30 attendees, means that we have 870 more community members who are prepared to be a

Our distress services have been busy, as always, and we are seeing a steady increase in incoming calls year over year. We have been able to answer over 35,000 calls in the 2022/2023 year and we are anticipating higher amounts this year. In 2023, we were happy to be able to take calls from the 9-8-8 National Suicide Helpline so that we can support more of our community members within BC and Canada.
