The Counselling Assistance program support community members with low financial barrier access to help from a clinical counselor. Many community members who seek support from outreach workers at WCSS could also benefit from additional help from a trained professional clinical counselor, although not all community members have the financial means or extended benefit programs that would cover the cost.

When it is identified that the services of a professional service provider would be beneficial, our outreach workers work with community members to find the best fit of a counselor. If financial restriction is a barrier to accessing the service on their own, this is when the Counselling Assistance program kicks in. Community members are matched with a suitable counselor, and are subsidized for up to 6 sessions in a calendar year. The cost to the community member is approx \$35 per session, while WCSS and the counseling assistance program pays the remaining \$100 per session. WCSS outreach workers continue to support and work alongside the community member to ensure complete wrap around support while they are working with a clinical counsellor.

In 2023 more than 100 people in community were supported through this program, at a cost of over \$50,000

Counselling assistance is one of over 30 programs administered by WCSS in the community. Outreach services offers programs such as concussion support, one on one wellness support meetings, cold weather shelter operations, new parent support group, mental health ambassador training, etc. Our food security team supports the community with Food Bank and in school snack programs. In total over 25,000 client visits were supported in our space. We also operate social enterprises including the Re-use-It and Re-Build-It centres which divert waste from the landfill, offer low cost foods to community members, and generate revenue to support the operations of the organization.
