

Ensuring player safety is a top priority for the league. We aim to provide each team with new batting helmets and supply four helmets to new teams. The estimated cost for these helmets is \$30-40 each, totaling approximately \$2205.

In light of the ongoing increase in living costs, we are determined to avoid raising team fees to maintain accessibility for more individuals. The funding we seek will be allocated to offset equipment and operational expenses, allowing us to sustain our team fees at the same level as the previous year.

Currently, we aim to supply each team with a new helmet, acknowledging the need for replacement due to potential loss or damage, with the updated plan of providing one helmet per team.
