The Whistler Mountain Ski Club is a non-profit organization that enables over 180 athletes ages 10 to 20, the majority from the Sea to Sky corridor, to develop and achieve theirs goals in Ski Racing. Our mission is to "Develop Champions in Life and Sport" and we aspire to provide a program to improve skiing skills, physical literacy, emotional intelligence, nutritional education, and overall health of our kids and athletes.

The purpose of this grant is to continue our in-house coach development and to offer NCCP courses and cross training with Canadian Ski Instructors courses (CSIA) and add more mental health training.

We currently have 9-full time coaches and 22 part time coaches through the 2023-24 season. Due to the nature of ski coaching and with the weather challenges of this season, there is little time for formal "in-house" development without compromising the delivery of the program. For this reason, we ran onboarding and training paid weekends prior to the start of the Winter season and will add one paid week after April 2024.

In our pursuit to recruit and retain top-tier coaches, we are committed to fostering a culture that prioritizes thier continous professional development, personal growth and overall well-being. We believe that investing in these aspects they will have the motivation to excell in their roles.

We are delighted wit the success of our recruitment efforts at WMSC. We proudly welcomed seven new coaches to our team, from both within the country and internationally that call Whistler home.
