Manabu Ikeda: Flowers from the Wreckage

Manabu Ikeda seeks inspiration from his surroundings to bring attention and awe to viewers, as a way of sending warnings about the painful reality of environmental disasters. Central to his practice are metaphors of human grief and undeniable aspects of life that are often beyond society's control, including the fundamental forces of Mother Nature. This is Ikeda's first major solo exhibition in North America featuring over fifty works from national and international public, private and corporate collections.
