What are the membership and participation requirements?	Players must register in advance, no experience necessary however space may be limited by volunteer coaching commitment. Parents are required to be on the field with the youngest age groups (age 3-5). 7U-U15 players are expected to attend practice twice per week, with games for he older ages groups on Saturdays in Whistler or Squamish.

The RMOW is generously providing us use of the Spruce Grove softball fields at no charge for May and June, including with on-site storage space during the season. We rent space (paid) for spring clinics at MPCS. Revenue streams include registration fees, grants and fundraising (including private donations and business sponsorships).

Grant funding is being solicited for the following specific purposes:

- \$2,500 for initial baseball purchase. Each season, baseball leagues are required to provide a variety of different types of baseballs to support each age group/team's development and skill level. Our purchase estimate includes 35 whiffle balls for young age groups (U7), 60 soft balls for developing players (U9), 192 hard balls for competitive teams (includes game balls, ages U11, U13) as well as 120 practice balls that will be divided evenly between the teams. All other equipment will be covered through fundraising efforts/fundraising matching from Whistler Blackcomb Foundation
- \$1,500 for Spring Player Clinics. In an effort to raise the caliber of our pitching to meet the needs of a competitive baseball league, we will be hosting two pitching and catching-specific clinics for U11, U13 and U15 age groups at Myrtle Phillip Community Centre in March, followed by weekly spring training sessions through the month of April. Pending grant approval, we hope to hire Inside Performance (baseball camps, out of North Vancouver) to assist in player training, at an estimate expense of \$1,500. This amount does not include RMOW venue rental. Whatever savings we can achieve through grants will be passed onto families in the form of reduced clinic fees, and we hope to accommodate as many kids as are interested.
- \$500 for Umpire Clinics. Qualified and accredited umpires are required for provincially-sanctioned games, and to assist in our umpire recruitment efforts, we would like to bring down the cost of these clinics by covering the training session cost. Whatever savings we can achieve will be passed onto those interested in becoming trained umpires.

Grant funding will also support our general fundraising goals:

- Covering as many organizational start-up costs as possible, including equipment purchase, provincial league fees, registration software, bolstering player registration, umpire recruitment and training, extending the length of the season through spring clinics (includes facility rentals), fostering player development through skill-specific training and building enthusiasm within our player community through a robust and sophisticated baseball club program
- Reducing any financial barrier to entry in the form of low registration costs for all participants, as well as having the funds to reduce or eliminate fees for families that cannot afford it
- Providing as much player equipment as possible so that the burden to purchase gear does not fall entirely on parents. This includes the league providing a kit for each team that includes shared team helmets, catchers equipment, bats and practice/game baseballs

WE ARE A NEW CLUB, built on previous trial clubs (i.e. Sea to Sky Minor Baseball, Howe Sound Baseball)

Key goals include introducing baseball to our youngest athletes (ages 3-5), fostering a supportive team environment for developing players (ages 5-9) and providing the opportunity for competitive team play for the many passionate baseball kids in our community (ages 10-15). In addition to playing local games, we are in discussions with both Howe Sound Baseball and North Shore Baseball to schedule interlock games that will promote more competition for older players (ages U11, U13 and U15). We also look forward to involving players in fundraising initiatives for both short- and long-term club goals.

3. Current Year Highlights and Community Benefits:

Despite our new organization being 100% volunteer-led and starting from scratch, in a short time we confirmed a Board of Directors with appropriate succession plan, gained charitable status and membership into BC Baseball, opened registration with healthy results, confirmed a BC Amateur Sports Foundation approved project, and secured a Whistler Blackcomb Foundation grant.

Whistler is blessed to have an abundance of individual activities for youth (skiing, mountain biking) however we believe that team sports are absolutely integral to youth development, including building confidence, developing teamwork, and promoting sport with all of its positive effects on physical and mental health. We are excited to join the growing community of team sports for our children in Whistler, and look forward to growing our organization for many years to come.

We have secured a WB Foundation grant of \$15,000 to purchase uniforms, with an additional 'fundraising matching' grant of up to \$6,500 for equipment purchase.

We are an 'approved project' from BC Amateur Sports Fund, who will administer our donation page and tax receipts, which will open the door for further grant opportunities. http://support.bcamateursportfund.org/P0553

We will graciously ask for private donations from our membership and their networks, as well as soliciting business sponsorships from the local business community to maximize the WBF matching grant.

Player-led club fundraising ideas also include: Hot Dog Car Wash, 50/50 tickets, Bottle Drive, etc. which will fund tangible benefits for the kids (i.e. a year-end party for all participants, medals, etc or long-term benefits to our club, i.e. a scoreboard or additional batting cage amenities).

We would like to note that our budget for this year is significantly higher than it will be in future years, as this years budget includes the purchase of all equipment, uniforms, etc. Looking ahead, we will have reduced annual costs as equipment and uniforms will only be replaced as required, whereas this year we do have to purchase everything!

If we were unsuccessful in our grant application, we will continue to pursue other grant opportunities but the reality is that we will likely have to rely more heavily on business sponsorship, which will prove challenging in the highly-competitive non-profit landscape of Whistler and British Columbia, especially following a tough winter for local businesses.
