Due to the success of our summer camp offerings, we are expanding beyond our Multi-Sport camps. In addition to the Art/Multi-Sport camp, we are rebranding to "Multi-Sport and More" camps, which will now include Music and Multi-Sport, and Cooking and Multi-Sport, alongside our original Art and Multi-Sport camp.

The purpose of the grant is to minimize financial barriers while providing high-quality coaching and leadership. Our leaders are required to continually enhance their skills, and this year, additional training will include two inclusive workshops: "All Youth Matter" and "Count Me In." These courses will equip leaders with the tools to work with marginalized and neurodiverse community members, ensuring our programming is delivered in a holistic and inclusive manner.

With the rising costs of field rentals, coaching, guest instructors for the Art, Music, and Cooking Multi-Sport camps, supplies, and the hiring of a dedicated Whistler adaptive coach to support participants requiring additional assistance, we seek supplementary revenue to avoid increasing the cost of the summer camp. This will help ensure that community members can afford to participate without financial strain.

The camps are not a new program; however, the new aspect of the program is the addition of two new camps, which add variety to our current offerings. Our goal is to meet the needs of the youth in our community.

I would like to ask the council to consider that the Legacy Sport Club has worked extremely hard to build partnerships, deliver inclusion, and provide safe sport training. Our goal is to offer inclusive, safe, and high-quality sports programs to the community.

The reason our total program operating budget is significantly higher than in previous years is that, for the first time, we have included the in-kind use of the Whistler Athletes Center facilities for the summer. Additionally, we have invested time and money into creating opportunities for community youth to gain volunteer and work experience through our Coach in Training program.

Over the past few years, the Legacy Sport Club's programs and camps have seen increased participation from individuals living with disabilities. We employ community members with disabilities and offer complimentary sports programs for families who would otherwise be unable to enroll their children in extracurricular activities. All of this has been achieved while exceeding Canada's safe sport instruction standards and keeping program fees as low as possible, thanks to financial support from initiatives like the Community Enrichment Program.
