Lighting Replacement: At Whistler Gymnastics, safety is a top priority for all our programs. One essential upgrade needed in our facility was the lighting. The original lighting system, installed in our first year of operation in 2013, had been in use for nearly twelve years. Over time, approximately 25% of the lights became non-functional, posing a safety risk, especially for our trampoline athletes. To address this, we collaborated with our facility partner, Whistler Sports Legacies, to replace the outdated lights with modern, energy-efficient LED lighting. The installation was completed over the last two weeks of December, ensuring that our gym is now properly illuminated for the safety and performance of our athletes and coaches.

As this expense was unanticipated when we were planning for this year, we are seeking \$5,000 to help subsidize the cost of this essential lighting upgrade.
