The microphones that we are using for various public events (the Christmas Eve Carol Service, the Remembrance Day Service, as well as the regular performances which we do at Christmas and in the spring) are 25 years old and are no longer capable of providing good quality sound for our group. We also share our equipment with the Children's Chorus, and they do concerts as well, including collaborating with us to the Carol Service and Remembrance Day.

The choirs have grown, and so have the venues. In recent times, we have performed at the Olympic Plaza, the Fairmont, and the Westin Hotel. We often receive comments from audience members about sound issues, minor complaints about clarity and volume. We believe that we would receive more positive feedback if we were able to use more modern technology.

As mentioned above, we present a non-denominational carol service every year, and we participate in the annual Remembrance Day service. We have been invited to perform in the past at a Canadian citizenship ceremony, and at the funeral of one of the founding members of the community which was open to the public.

The Children's Chorus has asked for support from the Whistler Community Foundation grants program. Since we have always shared our equipment and music, we can depend on each other for help. If we were lucky enough to get support from both organizations, we also need to purchase sheet music which is very expensive. We have not had a financial boost for this purpose in approximately 3 years when the Real Estate Association of Whistler gave us approximately \$1200 to buy music. To give you an example of what sheet music costs, we would be looking at approximately \$4/per copy and we need 60 copies. This comes to \$240 just for a set of one piece of music. We generally tackle about 10 new pieces each year, so we are looking at a minimum of \$2000 just to accomplish that.

Fees for membership in the choir are very low (\$150/year) and are sometimes waived when the individuals are not able to pay. The membership represents many different groups in Whistler, including newcomers to Whistler, several senior citizens, a large proportion of women, and many people with different international backgrounds. Everyone is welcome, and the group is very social, cultivating friendships, combating loneliness and social isolation. The music is interesting, educational, and enjoyable. We try to support our membership when they have a crisis, for example, serious medical problems.

Also, the community benefits by having good quality concerts provided at very affordable costs. Having good quality choirs in the Whistler community is an important asset to everyone who chooses to join in as participants and audience members.

SUPPORT FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION
