We have an urgent need to upgrade our Periwinkle playground covering to meet the required standards. This project will enhance the safety and sustainability of our outdoor play area by replacing the current sand ground cover with durable, rubber playground tiles. As a licensed childcare facility, we are required to commit to the "Standards of Practice Safe Play Spaces". This standard provides directions on specific height and depth guidelines for play structures and ground surfaces.

Currently, our ground covering is sand and unfortunately, it becomes packed down due to the weather and children playing. Despite constant raking and refilling, it does not meet the depth requirements, and it has become very costly and unsustainable. We need to install rubber tiles which will provide a long-lasting, maintenance-free solution that meets the necessary safety standards and ensures an enjoyable and safe play environment for the children. This project is a priority following feedback from our Licensing Officer during our last inspection.

Whistler Children's Centre was created by the community and has been serving the Whistler community for over 40 years. We:

- care for 100 Whistler children providing developmentally appropriate care

support 100 Whistler families with childcare, enabling parents and caregivers to work and participate in community life
 are the only childcare centre in Whistler that welcomes infants (children under 3 years old)

- are the only childcare centre in Whistler that welcomes every child, unlike some centres with exclusion policies. No child or family is turned away. Our centre supports this inclusive approach by ensuring we have the resources and training to provide lcare and support to every child. This includes, for example children who may be autistic or have learning or physical disabilities. We provide caring, non-judgmental care for Whistler's children, which in turn supports the parents and caregivers who contribute to the Whistler community and economy.

This grant request is critical for us as our budget has been significantly reduced due to the changes resulting from the BC government's Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative. Whilst this policy is welcome for its significant financial benefit to families, it has dramatically impacted our finances and cash flow because allowable increases are not keeping up with the rate of inflation and the Centre's increased operating costs, including for things like upgrading equipment and the playground.

We are pursuing all options to meet this urgent, significant gap in our funding (e.g., advocacy, fundraising, and grants) and we are hopeful the community will support us as we look for ways to continue to provide high quality, inclusive childcare. Providing Whistler's families with inclusive childcare from infancy to school-age is central to our philosophy, and our 40-year history has proven that we are adaptable and responsive to the community's needs. We are meeting a critical need for childcare in Whistler and provide care for an increasingly diverse group of children, including those who are not able to attend other childcare centres (often due to age or specific developmental or behavioural needs).?

SUPPORT FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

The RMOW is committed to working with the Lilwat People, known in their language as L'il'wat7úl and the Squamish People, known in their language as the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw to: create an enduring relationship; establish collaborative processes for planning on unceded territories, as currently managed by the provincial government; achieve mutual objectives; and enable participation in Whistler's resort economy.

9. How has your organization considered truth and reconciliation with the Indigenous Nations?

Our teachers acknowledge truth and reconcilliation by wearing orange shirts leading up to truth and reconcilliation day as a visual prompt to have discussions with the children as to what the orange shirts represent. We use this as a way to share stories that are developmentally age appropriate for the children in our care.

The facility is closed on Truth and Reconcilliation Day as a way to honour the children who never returned home and the survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. This gives our teachers the opportunity to volunteer or participate in local events and/or time to learn about our country's history.

Moving forward we continue to look at ways we could engage more deeply with the children by expanding our learning library and inviting Elders into our programs. We want to find ways that will have impact at a level the children can process and understand.
