We wish to host the camp in Whistler to attract athletes to BC and Whistler, and to promote Whistler as a sport tourist destination. - 2) Hosting Provincial, National and International Fencing tournaments and associated high performance camps, which attract visitors to BC and generate significant revenue for businesses, municipalities and the province. In 2025, we will be hosting several camps, senior and youth provincials, a Canadian national competition and an International world cup.
- 3) Creating successful competitive athletes, including Olympic games qualifiers, Pan-American Games champions, international world cup medalists, and national competition medalists, and by supporting numerous athletes to get full scholarships or Ivy League placements to compete in the NCAA.

We anticipate ~ 100+ attendees, representing 342 room nights. If successful and there is support from the municipality, we anticipate that this will have the potential to become an annual event, adding to the reputation of Whistler as a competitive sport tourist destination.
