Whistler Mountain Ski club (WMSC) is a non-profit youth ski racing organization dedicated to fostering athletic excellence, personal growth, and community engagement. With a strong presence in the Sea to Sky corridor, we provide ski training and development programs to more than 180 athletes aged between 6 and 20 years of age. Our mission is to "Develop Champions in Life and Sport" and we aspire to provide a program to not only improve skiing skills and physical literacy, but also emotional intelligence, nutritional education, confidence, discipline, mental resilience, and overall health for our athletes. All of this while cultivating sportsmanship and a lifelong passion for sport.

Our Key factor in achieving this objective is to attract the best top-tier coaches.

The purpose of this grant is to continue our in-house coach development and to offer National Coach Certification Program (NCCP) courses and cross training with Canadian Ski Instructors courses (CSIA).

We currently have 5 year round coaches, 5 full time seasonal coaches and 18 part time coaches. Due to the nature of our program, we conduct our on-boarding and professional development program to staff prior to the start of our winter season and on the last few weeks of the season (April and May)

In our pursuit of recruiting and retaining top-tier coaches, we are committed to fostering a culture that prioritizes their continuous professional development, personal growth, and overall well-being. We believe that by investing in these aspects, our coaches will be motivated to excel in their roles, ultimately enhancing the experience and success of our athletes.

We are pleased with the success of our recruitment efforts. This season, we retained six of our out of the province coaches who are already committed to stay in Whistler over the summer and return to coaching for the 2025-26 season. We also welcomed eight new coaches from other Canadian provinces and internationally. Their diverse expertise and commitment to excellence further strengthen our club's ability to deliver world-class training.

No, it is a continuation of our original plan that has proven to be successful for the retention and attraction of high quality ski coaches.

Following the introduction of our supplementary Fast Friday program for 8 and 9 years old last year. We extended the age range to skiers 6 to 10 years old and officially added a U10 program (9 years old) to our developmental programming this year. We continue to have the largest FIS program in the western provinces with 30 athletes. Our alumni are top performers in provincial and national teams. Two of our alumni, recently came 1st and 3rd place at the Kitzbuhel world cup downhill race. Which is the most iconic alpine race in the world The organization for the 33rd Whistler Cup event is well underway and the demand has been overwhelming. We expect over 400 skiers from Canada, US, and other international destinations. With the athletes, we anticipate an additional 600 visitors, including coaches, parents, and relatives.

Community Engagement: Central to our programs is community involvement, through volunteering. Hosting a race requires a minimum of 100 volunteers. These amazing individuals are the parents of our racers, members of the community, alumni, Whistler Weasels and supporters of ski racing. They all shared how their volunteering have transcended into lifelong friendships.

Smart Tourism - WMSC is recognized as a global destination for ski racers, we consistently attract participants from across Canada and around the world who come to train and compete with us. We take pride in the substantial economic contribution the Club makes to our community each year, aligning with the goals of Smart tourism. This impact is particularly noticeable in April when we host the Whistler Cup, the only youth international FIS race in North America. By bringing athletes and visitors during a time when the ski season is winding down and tourist numbers are lower. This helps sustain local business and tourism.

Housing - Like many organizations in Whistler, we face challenges due to the high costs of living, which affect our ability to attract and retain coaches. To address this, WMSC has a filed petition to build staff housing. Our financial reserves are allocated specifically for this purpose.
