1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor J. Crompton recognized that the Meeting is being held on the traditional territories of the Lil'wat Nation and the Squamish Nation.

4. **PRESENTATIONS AND DELEGATIONS**

5. PUBLIC QUESTION AND ANSWER PERIOD

Paul Hothersall, 2240 Gondola Way

Re: Highway repairs at Nordic

Mr. Hothersall asked if it would be possible for the RMOW to apply pressure on the highway contractor with regards to repairs at bottom of Nordic hill on Highway 99. He noted that there have already been two vehicles in the ditch, and the repairs to date have not held. He noted that this is a safety issue.

Mayor J. Crompton referred this matter to staff.

Re: Whistler water quality

Mr. Hothersall asked if it is the position of the RMOW that running the water until it is cold will mean that the water is safe to drink.

Mayor J. Crompton responded that that is the direction the RMOW has been given from Vancouver Coastal Health.

Mr. Hothersall asked if the RMOW has any water quality test results from testing at the tap.

Mayor J. Crompton responded that Vancouver Coastal Health directs where testing is done. He added that lead in the homes is from the fixtures and that the RMOW is meeting the requirements of the certificate to provide water. He noted that the RMOW abides by the direction given from Vancouver Coastal Health.

Mr. Hothersall asked if backflow valves prevent stagnant water from unused houses from leaching back into the main water system.

General Manager of Infrastructure Services J. Hallisey responded that it is included in building code that every house is required to have the backflow device. He added that the RMOW is currently enforcing this in commercial properties.

Mr. Hothersall asked if funds could be allocated to the reserves as a pre-emptive measure for funding towards potential changes to the way water in Whistler is treated, rather than wait for the report to come to Council.

Mayor J. Crompton responded that Council will review options based on the report that will be presented in the first quarter of 2020.

6. MAYOR'S REPORT

Family Après

Mayor J. Crompton noted that Family Après launched last week at Whistler Olympic Plaza. He added that the Whistler Holiday Experience begins on Saturday, December 21, 2018. He noted that this free programming offers indoor activities for families at the Whistler Conference Centre until January 5, 2020. The New Year's Eve festivities start at noon with an extended Family Après and activities at Whistler Conference Centre. Mayor J. Crompton noted that there will also be the High-Flying Snow Show and an early countdown for children, and at 11:30 p.m. there will be a Special Edition Fire and Ice Show, midnight countdown and fireworks.

Hotel Association

Mayor J. Crompton noted that he had the opportunity to speak to the Hotel Association of Whistler Board last week.

Whistler Chamber of Commerce AGM

Mayor J. Crompton attended the Whistler Chamber of Commerce held their AGM and Diversity and Inclusion Lunch.

Whistler Film Festival

Mayor J Crompton noted that he attended the opening night Film and Awards Ceremony at the 19th Whistler Film Festival. The event included 96 film screenings, events, and industry and talent programs. He congratulated the organizers of the Whistler Film Festival on a tremendous event.

Viessmann Luge World Cup

Mayor J. Crompton noted that the Luge World Cup event was held last weekend at the Whistler Sliding Centre. He added that Whistler was the third stop on the World Cup luge circuit with more than 100 athletes from 20 countries. He noted that the runs were also broadcast live at Whistler Olympic Plaza. Mayor J. Crompton noted that local Whistler athlete Reid Watts and Pemberton athlete Trinity Ellis both competed. Mayor J. Crompton congratulated Whistler athletes Caitlin Nash and Natalie Corless and noted that they were the first women ever to compete in a World Cup doubles event. He added that they were awarded a bronze medal in the Pacific Championships race within a race.

Tenth Anniversary of the 2010 Olympic Games

Mayor J. Crompton noted that Whistler will be celebrating the tenth anniversary of the 2010 Games this February and March. Throughout the two-month period, there will be exciting programming at the Whistler Public Library to bring the community together. He added that these events will also provide a reunion for everyone who participated: from

organizers, to volunteers, to torch bearers, to athletes and spectators. More details about the programming will be released in January.

Adventure Smart

Mayor J. Crompton reminded everyone, with the wintery weather, to be adventure smart. He noted that hikers and bikers should bear in mind that trails are not winter maintained and to be prepared, wear appropriate clothing and footwear, and be cautious of bridges heavily loaded with snow. He added that ice on Whistler's lakes isn't monitored for thickness and safety, and if anyone plans to skate or walk on ice, to be educated on ice thickness and be prepared to self-rescue. Mayor J. Crompton also advised that Whistler's significant backcountry terrain has avalanche risks, and that those using it should learn safe travel and prepare for changes in conditions and weather when snowshoeing, skiing and snowboarding.
