The grant will be used to fund part of the payment for our 2021 Writer in Residence author, Joseph Boyden. Boyden's fee is \$6,000 (Writers Union Standard fee). We kindly request the Community Enrichment Program to cover \$4,500.

The Whistler Writing Society will take care of all other costs associated with the program, including the author's travel, administration, accommodation and promotion of the program. The CEP grant is important to our local writers because it makes the program affordable to residents in the Sea to Sky Corridor. If provincial health recommendation advise against in-person learning in September & October, we will transition to online delivery of the program. In 2020 we successfully pivoted to online programs for the Whistler Writers Festival.

The Whistler Writer in Residence provides four one-on-one feedback sessions as well as four group seminars on different aspects of writing craft, writing life and publishing industry. This type of intensive, craft-focused instruction is not available in Whistler except through this program.

The Writer in Residence (WIR) program provides cultural enrichment and learning opportunities for resident writers in our own community, and increases access for residents to high-level Canadian authors and mentors. The WIR program means that local writers don't have to travel to an urban centre to study the writing craft, thereby protecting the environment. Economic viability is fostered because this program grows the capacity of local writers, which in turn enables them a greater ability to self-support. The program enriches the writing skills of locals, a benefit to Whistler businesses. The WIR recognizes that Whistler can be used as a retreat and place of further development and education for our own literary artists. "Partnering for success" opportunities are created by the proposed initiatives, which connect local groups and the Federal government to provide ongoing development and training to writers in our community. Feedback from participants is incorporated into future decision-making for the program.
