The focus of the workshop would be for our players ages 10 – 18 using the game of hockey as a metaphor for life. Strategic Play would facilitate the leadership workshops that would develop interpersonal skills on and off the ice in order to become the next generation of leaders. Using play-based methods to reach and engage our participants, the program will cover: communication, team building, leadership, problem solving, conflict management, visioning, goal setting and anti-bullying. This is a well-established program via online workshops using 'LEGO Serious Play'. The program will create a playful 3D environment that supports thinking, creativity and reflection with the use of Lego bricks and will be taught in an age appropriate way.</p>


