1) We are seeking funds to purchase 2 new Optimist Sailboats.

Our Fleet of Optimist Sailboats are used every day in our sailing programs for kids age 5-13 yrs. Our "Wet Feet" program for younger kids aged 5-7 is growing rapidly and we are in need of more small sailboats to accommodate that age group. \$9500

2) Safety Helmets.

In 2019, the CEP funded the purchase of safety helmets for our kids and youth sailors. The implementation was very successful. Our 5-7yrs age group (Wet Feet) is growing, and we require an additional 15 helmets in size extra small for this program. \$1495

- Use of the "Old Youth Hostel" site, ensuring a clean and family orientated park with water access, for the community to share with us. * WSA works in cooperation with RMOW Summer Camps. Camp Breakout and Camp Action Adventure groups. Those programs were canceled due to capacity restrictions from COVID-19, but we hope to offer those programs again in 2021.

- 1) Enriching community life: WSA is focused on teaching and learning for ages 5-85. Sailing is like riding a bike; it's for life. Access to learning opportunities and lifelong learning is identified as an important aspect of community life in Whistler. Training for employment: 3 coaches on our staff learned how to sail with us by volunteering and training. They are now paid fully certified instructors. WSA offers accredited courses recognized internationally following the Sail Canada Curriculum.
- 2) Enhancing the Resort Experience: WSA is providing an activity/experience that otherwise may not be available. Locals and visitors are welcome to sail with us, and experience the beauty of our resort town from the water.
- 3) Protecting the Environment: Sailing is a green sport, as wind is a renewable resource. We operate with a very small carbon footprint, and we now have 2 electric outboard motors in our fleet of safety boats.
- 4) Ensuring Economic Viability: WSA operates as a non-profit with a responsibly managed budget. WSA operates on RMOW property with a very low impact to the local taxpayer with a net benefit to local residents.
- 5) Partnering for Success: Whistler Sailing has grown organically through a cooperative approach in the community, including support from the RMOW for access to the site, the Whistler Blackcomb Foundation with financial support, and local businesses for donations at our annual fundraiser to name a few.


