The Whistler Waldorf School (WWS) respectfully requests funding in the amount of \$2095.75

This funding will be used for capital purchases for our two Group Childcare Facilities including: permanently installed equipment (two light blocking window shades), large educational materials (oversized wood blocks); and learning materials (art supplies/books) intended to encourage conversations about race and diversity.

WWS is a not-for-profit organization that is in good standing with the Ministry of Children and Family Development and currently holds Group Child Care licenses to offer childminding to children 30 months-school age out of two locations - Spruce Grove and Spring Creek. The Spruce Grove program is projected to be at full capacity for Sept 2021 as we have a robust wait pool of applicants and the Early Years Centre in Spring Creek is currently over 90% capacity.

WWS provides the community with a financially accessible, experiential and arts based education to approximately 200 local students and their families. Having school choice in Whistler is something that helps students, families and the school system as a whole. While the public system offers a great option for many families, children are unique. Lumping everyone into the same system might not be optimal for everyone. School choice policies underpin pluralism in society and allows families to choose a school to best meet the needs of their child and their own values within a frame of common social values. We provide licensed group childcare for over 40 local families. Our playschool age childrne enjoy days filled with warmth, wonder, guided activities and their own initiative. Our childcare program helps children lay a strong foundation for life.

We fundraise annually. Nearly \$20,000 of the cost of our Early Years Centre Spring Creek childcare was paid for through funds raised at our fundraising gala with the remainder from grants obtained. Our 2020 fundraising gala was cancelled due to Covid-19, but instead we ran a successful annual giving campaign in Dec 2020 with proceeds going toward projects that impact WWS students' educational experience (computers and tech upgrades, student transportation and venue rental, etc.)

While no other grants have been applied for at this time, our organization does generally submit a grant application to the Whistler Blackcomb Foundation.

Whistler families are in need of quality childcare and the Whistler Waldorf School wishes to provide that. Our school's vision and mission are to provide young children with a nurturing, safe and homelike environment, to support their growth and well-being. Supporting the Whistler Waldorf School's efforts to improve and enhance our childminding programs in Whistler helps ensure that the early learning needs of more children in our community are met. The availability of high-quality childcare strengthens families and contributes to the creation of a strong social fabric.

Having a provincially certified Waldorf school in Whistler greatly enriches community life by providing quality programming and a choice in educational options for the residents of Whistler, allowing more families access to the education they desire within our community. Having different models of education in the resort community broadens learning opportunities for the community and opens doors for families from other communities to consider Whistler as a place to relocate. Annually our school attracts 6-12 families to our community. These families are looking for a holistic independent education for their children and willing to move permanently to Whistler based on our ability to provide a quality educational option.

Inaccessible and unaffordable childcare keeps parents out of the workforce and prevents families from saving money and planning for the future. The presence of accessible childcare is shown to stimulate economic growth by increasing participation in the workforce and therefore spending and tax revenue. As an organization we have opted in to the The Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative (CCFRI) which enhances child care affordability to families.

In addition, WWS employs 36 faculty and staff, creating and maintaining reasonable, professional jobs that diversify our resort community's economy through the support and ongoing development of a lifelong learning culture in Whistler. The Whistler Waldorf School believes childcare is essential for a child's development and are committed to compensating our faculty accordingly – we offer our Early Childhood Educators between \$20-25/hour which is higher than industry standard.
