1-Declare a climate emergency

2-Legislate that all municipal spending must reduce emissions, until we have exceeded our Big Moves climate targets

Every budget item should include a line outlining how much GHG reduction is expected from this expenditure. We could then prioritize our spending based on what will have the most impact.

This will result in a war-like focus on climate action.

This will change business-as-usual, no doubt about it. Many planned projects will have to be delayed or cancelled. This will allow Whistlerites to look back at this time (early 2020s) with pride.

Will it cause an emergency if this budget item is not completed immediately? If yes, proceed the minimum viable project.
