## **RECOMMENDATION FROM THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER**

That the recommendation of the General Manager of Corporate and Community Services be endorsed.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Council endorse the RMOW's application for the BC Hydro Beautification Grant; and

**That** Council offer a formal expression of support to cover the remaining two-thirds of estimated BC Hydro costs by establishing a local service area, and related local area service tax payable, for the Alta Vista neighbourhood.

## PURPOSE OF REPORT

To secure Council endorsement for advancing the submission requirements of the BC Hydro Beautification Grant funding application.

## DISCUSSION

## **Background**

In August 2020, Council received, and referred to staff, a <u>letter from Mr. Crosland Doak</u> expressing the interest of a collection of Alta Vista residents sufficient to initiate a formal petition process consistent with *Community Charter* Section 212 for the undergrounding of overhead utility services. This correspondence further requested that municipal staff apply to the BC Hydro Beautification Grant program to support the funding of the potential undergrounding project.

While the RMOW is not required to provide works and services related to the undergrounding of overhead utility services, staff realize we have the ability to assist residents with this project. The RMOW's decision to apply for the BC Hydro grant and undertake the formal petition process to create a local service area are distinct and separate. If the application for the BC Hydro Beautification Grant is unsuccessful, the RMOW may still proceed with the undergrounding project and funding will be through the creation of a local service area, pending a successful petition process.

In September 2020, staff presented to Council <u>BC Hydro Beautification Grant – Alta Vista</u> <u>Neighbourhood Service Undergrounding Petition</u>, Report 20-091. Council endorsed the recommendation to proceed with the grant application, and to approve funding for the RMOW portion of the undergrounding project costs not covered by the BC Hydro Beautification Grant. The spending funded by the RMOW would be recovered through a Local Area Service tax payable over time, by all parcels located within the identified Service Area.

On February 18, 2021, a letter was received from BC Hydro stating the RMOW would not be receiving grant funding for the Alta Vista beautification project. The reason given was that funding for this program had been exhausted. The letter went on to say the RMOW could either proceed without BC Hydro funding or defer the project and reapply to the Beautification Program next year.

On September 03, 2021, a follow-up letter from Mr. Crosland Doak was received and attached as Appendix A to this report, reaffirming the support of Alta Vista residents as detailed in his 2020 correspondence. In addition, the letter respectfully requests the RMOW to submit a new application to the BC Hydro Beautification Grant program.

## <u>Analysis</u>

## **BC Hydro Beautification Fund**

BC Hydro's Beautification Fund provides financial assistance to municipal governments for conversion of overhead lines and poles to underground facilities in order to enhance and improve the use of public spaces. Successful applicants receive funding equal to one-third of BC Hydro's estimated project cost, with the remaining two-thirds to be arranged by the municipality. Cost sharing is based on the original project scope, and does not include any costs for work on private property or work to relocate other utility attachments such as telecom cables.

The BC Hydro Beautification Grant application requires a formal expression of Council's support to cover the remaining two-thirds of estimated BC Hydro costs. In support of the petition process initiated by Alta Vista residents, staff are looking for Council to endorse the RMOW's application for funding under the BC Hydro Beautification Fund for the proposed project prior to the application deadline of September 30, 2021. Direction is being sought to endorse this new application.
